

SO 3288 BISHOP'S CASTLE C.P. HIGH STREET (west side)

12/43 Nos. 19 - 23 (odd) -

GV II

Three houses, now 3 shops, house and flats. Circa 1600, underbuilt, refaced and eaves raised in early to mid-C19, and late-C19 additions. Rendered timber frame with slate roof. 5 framed bays. 2 storeys and gable-lit attic. Brick stack behind ridge, off-centre to right. Framing: square panels. Nos. 19 and 21: late-C19 double-gabled extension to front; 2 first floor glazing bar sashes with moulded architraves; 2 late-C19 ground floor shop fronts, that to left with segmental-arched tori-lights and half-glazed door to right with 2-part overlight, and that to right with small panes and 4-flush-panelled door to right with rectangular overlight. No. 23: three first floor mid- to late-C19 casements, ground floor late-C19 four-paned sash to left, and central late-C19 four flush-panelled door; late-C19 slate-roofed lean-to shop to right with 5-light shop window to right and 4 flush-panelled door to left. Interior: former moulded bressumer and out-of-line posts are evidence of former continuous jetty, now underbuilt; C17 newel staircase in No. 23.
